There is a prospective student exchange opportunity for the Berkeley-Sakai Association. Member Maylou Bartlett is an International Coordinator for the Aspect Foundation, an international student exchange program. She is currently looking for host families to provide a caring, supportive environment for a high school student (15-18) for one year or one semester. The student will attend Berkeley High School. The host family must fill out a detailed application and provide a room, food and some transportation. Kindergarten Art Exchange Carolyn Rising

We're delighted to have the students of Libby Trumbull's Thousand Oaks kindergarten class participate in the Berkeley-Sakai Kindergarten Art Exchange again. Most of the art was completed after a class field trip to Tilden Park. Their stories reflected their surprise at encountering a banana slug that felt "jelly squishy" on their walk under the deciduous trees, which were shedding their colorful leaves. They particularly enjoyed the denizens of the Little Farm. They were allowed to feed them "celery, but not bread."

We also sent samples of other art completed prior to Christmas including self portraits reflecting their interests, "I am thankful for . . . " Thanksgiving stories and some colorful marble paintings. This art is usually hung in Sakai's City Hall at the end of February. Berkeley receives art from kindergartners in Sakai in late March and April. Art Exchange Vicki Chardak

This September 24 artists from the sister cities Berkeley, CA and Sakai, Japan, came together to exhibit contemporary art at the ACCI Gallery in Berkeley. The show Pacific Bridge: Art from Sister Cities included painters, photographers, sculptors and a glass artist. The artist exchange coincided with the Sakai Goodwill visit; the artists joined in most of the Goodwill events and were also taken to Sonoma Plaza, the Di Rosa, the De Young museum and the Legion of Art in San Francisco. There was an informal exchange at the gallery that Jay Sordean videotaped and local internationally known artist Keiko Nelson translated, and afterwards gave a short talk about her work.

Since 2004 the Berkeley Bridge Artists has had an ongoing cultural dialogue and collaborative exhibitions with the artists of Sakai. As part of the 2014 artist cultural exchange, eight Sakai artists visited Berkeley and participated in home stays, studio, museum and gallery visits.

The Fifth Annual Berkeley-Sakai Photography Exchange Gary Gibson

The Berkeley-Sakai Digital Photography Exchange, or Photo Exchange for short, is now in its fifth year. The Photo Exchange was established in 2010 as a way to connect High School students from Berkeley and Sakai. The goal of the photo exchange is to promote a cultural dialogue through the photographs taken by the students of the sister cities. The teachers who manage the exchange believe that art and the art-making process is a universal experience, and that photography is a great lens for seeing into the worlds in which we live. Through the photographs, the students can create a shared awareness of what it means to be a teenager in the two sister cities. The combination of two modern technologies, digital photographs and the Internet, allow us to create a shared experience that transcends the limits of time and space.

This has been an exciting project for the participants in the exchange. It has allowed them to gain a more personal look into the lives of fellow high school students in another land.

In previous years, the students have shared photographs on the themes of light, friendship, their respective cities, and faces. This year's theme is "Portraiture," a simple project focused on the art of the portrait. It is hoped is that this will result in photographs that show friends and family, both young and old.

The teachers from Berkeley High School and Sakai High School are currently negotiating the schedule for this year's exchange. The initial proposed schedule has the exchange running from mid-April through May. Submissions will be coordinated by the photography teachers of both schools (via the Dropbox cloud service), and will be displayed in a virtual gallery on the website:

Along with the subject photographs, each student photographer will provide a picture of themselves, along with their name, their age, and a message about their hope for the future. In this way we will promote the Berkeley-Sakai Sister City Association ideal of "Creating a Peaceful World through Culture and Friendship.

Everyone involved is very excited to continue the annual photo exchange.
